General Information

Vacation Care is for 5-12 year old children attending primary school. Staff are employed from 6.30am – 6:00 pm. Children are to be signed in and out by a parent/guardian. Please DO NOT leave your child at the centre prior to staff arrival.

Medication

Prescription medication can only be administered by staff once the required medical form has been completed. Medications must be in original packaging or medication cannot legally be administered.

What to Bring

Children need to bring lunch, snacks for morning and afternoon tea as well as a refillable drink bottle. Help us be allergy friendly! Many children have allergies to various nuts. Please help by not providing any nuts or nut products (peanut butter, hazelnut spread) in your children's lunches and snacks. Cooking activities may be a part of the day's program, but they are not meal substitutes. Children are responsible for their personal belongings and valuables at Vacation Care if they are lost or damaged.

What to Wear

Please clearly label all items!

Sunhat – no hat means children may only be allowed to play in the shade. Children without hats may miss out on outdoor activities. Sunscreen will be provided at the Centre, however please apply sunscreen to your child every day before dropping them to Vacation Care.

Clothing should be sun smart. Singlet tops are not appropriate as exposed shoulders are prone to sunburn. Please note that at Vacation Care kids often do messy activities so be prepared for messy clothes at the end of the day.

Covered shoes only – thongs, slides and most sandals are not appropriate or safe footwear at Vacation Care. Children who do not have proper footwear may not be able to participate in all activities. Weather appropriate clothing must be worn or packed daily including jumpers and pants in Winter. Please provide spare underwear and clothing in your child's bag if they are prone to have toilet accidents.

Water Safety

Water Safety is a major aspect with the delivery of Vacation Care programs. Some of our activities have water elements and with this we take every safety precaution possible. All excursions have risk assessments and staff are qualified with First Aid. Supervision maps are made for educators to minimise all risks.

Excursions & Incursions

All Incursions and Excursions have risk assessments completed on the proposed activity. Active OOSH strives to ensure complete safety when dealing with our children. Staff meetings are completed daily in relation to the advised activity, mapping out the entire excursion so all staff are aware of the day's proceedings. Supervision maps are drawn for the educators, all excursions adhere to the National Regulations. Any queries about excursions and details please see the nominated Supervisor. PG rated movies and G rated video games may be shown at the centre.

Bus Transport

Excursions that require bus services are outlined on the Vacation Care Program. For large groups, we use a registered bus service and all buses are equipped with seatbelts where possible. For small groups, we use our centre mini bus accompanied by a qualified driver.

Costings

- Bronze Day** - \$56 per day (In most cases after the full Child Care Subsidy is applied there will be a gap to be paid of **ONLY \$10.78**)
Silver Day - \$65 per day (In most cases after the full Child Care Subsidy is applied there will be a gap to be paid of **ONLY \$12.51**)
Gold Day - \$75 per day (In most cases after the full Child Care Subsidy is applied there will be a gap to be paid of **ONLY \$14.44**)
Diamond Day - \$85 per day (In most cases after the full Child Care Subsidy is applied there will be a gap to be paid of **ONLY \$16.36**)
